






he 2007 Gold and Silver Circle

"Fifteen years of Emmy Awards in Television"

t 16, Bill Asher's father died suddenly. The family moved to New York and Asher made his way back to Hollywood and got a job at Universal Studios in the mailroom for \$12.00 a week. Bill made the studio's ten soundstages his classrooms. Instructors were the directors, cinematographers and editors. WW II was Bill's graduate studies. When he returned to Hollywood, it was as an editor and cameraman.

His television career started with directing assignments on Big Town and The Colgate Comedy Hour. Bill's work on the series Racket Squad so impressed CBS Vice President Harry Ackerman that CBS hired Bill to direct the pilot on a new comedy called Our Miss Brooks.

Desi Arnaz took notice of the seamless direction on the new pilot and wooed Asher to direct the second season of I Love Lucy. His first Lucy show was the classic candy factory episode. Bill stayed on for 103 Lucy episodes-- almost the entire series run-- overseeing unforgettable years of television, including the birth of Little Ricky, Lucy's escapades in Hollywood and the final batch of I Love Lucy episodes where the Ricardo's move to the country. No other director in Lucille Ball's career would direct her in so many episodes. Bill's flair for orchestrating physical comedy would be the hallmark

of I Love Lucy and many more of Bill's directorial assignments. In 1953 and 1954 Bill received his first of many Emmys for I Love Lucy for Best Situation Comedy.

A Desilu production hardly ever went on the air without Bill's touch. That included Make Room for Daddy, where he was honored with another Emmy for Best New Program. In the mid-1950's Bill took on other television productions such as Jane Wyman's Fireside Theatre, Fibber McGee and Molly and The Thin Man. He received another Emmy for the Dinah Shore Chevy Show .


In 1961 Bill Asher staged and directed President John F. Kennedy's Inaugural Gala, produced by Frank Sinatra. That spring he did the same for the President's surprise birthday celebration where Marilyn Monroe sang.

The fall of 1963 marked the launch of The Patty Duke Show and the hit show Bewitched. Bewitched marked the start of an eight-year run comprising 254 episodes. Bill directed more than half of the shows and received an Emmy for Best Comedy Direction in 1966.

The 60's also saw the debut of his Beach Blanket Bingo Films and the new series Gidget. Gidget launched the television career of Academy Award, Golden Globe and Emmy award winning Actress Sally Field. The final episode of Bewitched aired in July 1972. Two months later Bill was back on the air with The Paul Lynde Show, Temperatures Rising and Marcus Welby M.D. Next came Alice. The critically acclaimed Emmy-winning show debuted in 1976 and Asher directed 27 episodes followed by directing and producing The Dukes of Hazzard.

Bill has brought countless hours of entertainment to television audiences all over the world yet has always found time for his six children, Liane, Brian, Billy, Robert, Rebecca and John and is the proud stepfather of Charlie, Mary, Merritt and David. He and his wife Meredith have been active in multiple Palm Springs Valley-based charities.





Silver Circle Inductee

Dasid Garcia

Multiple Emmy Award Recipient Journalist

"The simple truth will always speak for itself"-David Garcia

he recipient of 14 Emmy Awards and 30 Emmy nominations, David Garcia has also received three Los Angeles Golden Mike Awards, a Press Club Award and was nominated for a Peabody Award.

David's career began while at Baylor College in Temple, Texas. He was offered a job on a local radio station in Dallas. Two years later, at age 22, David was offered the job as ABC News correspondent. Arriving in NYC at the same time was Ted Koppel. David recalls that he was the first Hispanic ever hired by a network.

David was moved to Washington D.C. He reported on the Nixon Impeachment, the Watergate Trials, Presidents Gerald Ford and Jimmy Carter and was named White House Correspondent. His stories ran the gamut from the easing of the Cold War to the Camp David Accords.

David was named ABC South America Bureau Chief and stationed in Miami. One of the highlights of this assignment was being in Cuba when Barbara Walter's did her famous "20/20" interview with Castro. Another was seeing the Amazon and rain forests, which awakened his love of environmental reporting.

David spent a short time in Chicago and then moved to KCBS Los Angeles and then KNBC as an Anchor/Feature Reporter. While in LA, David received his first Emmy Awards, Reagan and Revolution - Best Documentary, Castro and the Caribbean - Best Documentary, 30 Sec. Hook - Best Feature Reporter, Vietnam 10 Years Later - Best Documentary.

KNBC came to him with an offer that David called, "his dream as a journalist". David would become Los Angeles' first full time
Environmental Anchor. One of his first stories
Mono Lake - received the Emmy for Best Feature Reporter, followed by Emmys for Beryllium:
Deadly Wonder - Best Reporter, Ring of Fire
two Emmy's - Writing and Producing, St. George
Utah/Nuclear Testing - News Story.

Then David joined FOX-LA and his story Ancient Medicine: Modern Cures about a village in Brazil received two Emmys - Writing and Producing.

In the late 90's David was honored with the Emmy for Outstanding News Writer followed by two more Emmys, Alaska- Best Multi-Part Series and Cliff Dancers - Best Feature Reporting.

David semi-retired and formed J. David Productions. He recalls that his semi retirement lasted about two weeks. Recent activities include working with PBS, California Connected, working with friend Jess Marlow on KCET's, Life and Times and weekly feature stories to the new CBS-2 in the Coachella Valley. David also began his new series called Go West with David Garcia and Healthy Living focusing on the Eisenhower Medical Center.

David and his wife Susie are active in giving back to their community, especially to the Pegasus Riding Academy for the Handicapped. David is fond of saying we have never been so busy or so happy.



REMINDER

DVD-R Entries for Emmy 2007

Emmy entries for all NATAS chapters will be on DVD this year. Below is the language from the National office that will be included in the "Call for Entries".

ENTRY FORMAT:

Entries will be accepted on DVD only. The readability of the DVD is the responsibility of the entrant. DVDs that cannot be 'read' cannot be judged and entry fees will not be refunded.

The following guidelines shall apply:

- DVD-R format (DVD minus-R).
- DVDs must be finalized and 'compatibility tested' on a different DVD player than the one used to burn the entry.
- Brand-name disks are recommended.
- Printed DVD labels (paper labels) are not suggested; instead, use a permanent marker to legibly PRINT identifying marks on the disk. Ink jet or laser printing that can be applied directly to the DVD face (printable media) is acceptable.
- Use a clear sleeve or case.
- One entry per DVD.

If you have stories that you know you are going to submit, it might be practical to begin saving them to **DVD-R** at this time to avoid the rush in January.
